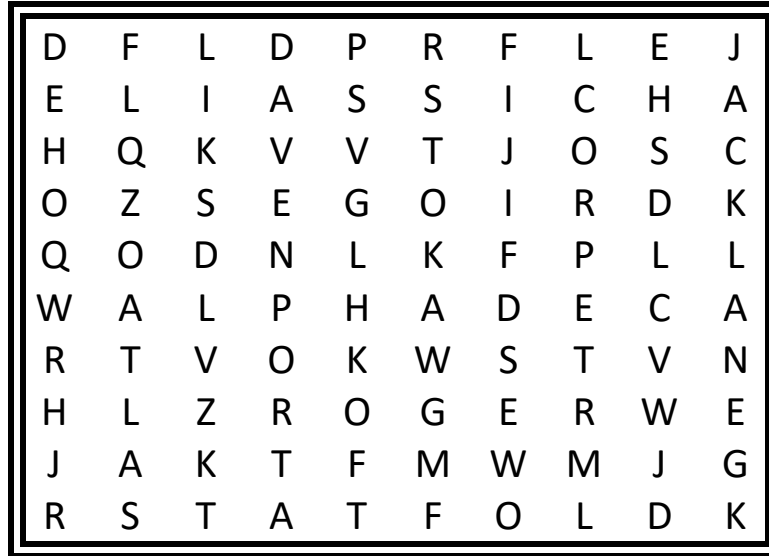


Statfold Barn Railway Word Search



Liassic – built in 1923 this small locomotive worked in Warwickshire before leaving to go Canada, before arriving at Statfold in 2012.

Davenport – Davenport were the American builder of Ryam Sugar Company No.1 which worked in India before arriving at Statfold in May 2013.

Roger – This small engine was built in 1918 and worked in Bristol before being preserved to Canada and arrived finally at Statfold in 2016 after crossing the Atlantic Ocean four times!

Corpet – Corpet were the French builder of our Minas de Aller No.2. It was built in 1884 and worked at a Spanish coal mine before being restored at Statfold.

Fiji – Fiji was built in 1912 to work in Fiji pulling sugar cane. It arrived at Statfold in 2012 and was named Fiji on the Ffestiniog & Welsh Highland Railway in North Wales.

Alpha – Alpha was built in Leeds and went to India to pull sugar cane. It came to Statfold 2013 and restored so it could pull passengers instead of sugar.

Atlas – Atlas is a small diesel that worked for the Ministry of Defence before being preserved at the former Abbey Light Railway when the railway closed it came to Statfold.

Jack Lane – Jack Lane was named after where the Hunslet works were in Leeds. It was built right here at Statfold.

Statfold – Statfold was built here at Statfold in 2005 and has been in operation ever since. It has also visited a number of other narrow-gauge steam railways across the UK.
